Ross Medical Centers collect 360 books for children's hospitals

DAVISON — Ten Ross Medical Education Center campuses throughout Michigan, including the location in Davison at 815 S. State St., held a book drive to benefit hospitalized kids this year.

The Madison Heights campus led the drive with 80 books for the Children's Hospital of Michigan, followed by Grand Rapids with 58 books for Helen DeVos Children's Hospital and 40 books from the New Baltimore campus for Children's Hospital of Michigan.

Students and staff were asked to bring in new, unwrapped books for kids, ages 6 months to 18 years of age. The public was also invited to participate.

Other hospitals that received book donations include: C.S. Mott Children's Hospital, Hurley Medical Center, Sparrow Hospital and Mercy Health Partners.
